Did you know... young veterans returning from service often have a harder time finding employment than their non-veteran peers. The unemployment rate for vets aged 18-24 is over 20%.

Sure, that
recruiter is probably a nice guy! But
keep in mind that he has a quota to make and is
trained to be pretty good at what he does. It is okay
for you to tell him no and also to ask that he
stop contacting you.

Sad but true... vets are subject to increased risks of alcoholism, drug addiction, and severe depression. An estimated 20% of recent combat veterans suffer from PTSD, believed to be a significant factor in the high suicide rates seen in this population.

Section 9b states that the DOD can change your job assignment at any time for any reason. The contract also states that you are on the hook for eight years, during which time you can be forced back into active duty. Know what you are signing up for!
